

## TYPES OF ERROS RELATED TO PATTERNS OF PREPOSITIONS OF PLACE AMONG SECOND LANGUAGE LEARNERS IN ENGLISH

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Identifying the errors committed by students while they are learning a language is important in order to analyze them and make students correct in achieving their language competency. The aim of this study is to find out the patterns of prepositions of place 'at' errors made by the Tamil learners of English in their first year at the South Eastern University of Sri Lanka. This study represents sampling from all communities that speak Tamil as their first language, both male and female participants, and the participants represent all parts of the island, such as the east, north, west, and south. To find out the types of errors, a diagnostic test was conducted by the researcher among the Islamic Studies and Arabic Language faculty students of the South Eastern University of Sri Lanka. The results of the study explored two types of errors related to the preposition of place 'at": wrong substitution and preposition omission. Concerning the significance of the correctness of the prepositions of place, this research helps to raise awareness among the learners and teachers about being competent in prepositions of place.

In response to these pressing concerns, this research proposes a series of evidence-based solutions aimed at fostering mental well-being in online learning environments. These solutions encompass the implementation of mindfulness practices, stress management techniques, and self-care strategies to support students' emotional resilience. Furthermore, initiatives to cultivate virtual communities, peer support networks, and mentorship programs can help mitigate feelings of isolation and promote social connectedness in online settings. Additionally, integrating mental health resources and support services directly into online learning platforms can enhance accessibility and facilitate timely intervention for students in distress. By illuminating the intersection of online learning and mental health, this study offers valuable insights for educators, policymakers, and mental health practitioners to develop targeted interventions and support mechanisms. Ultimately, prioritizing the holistic well-being of learners is essential in fostering inclusive and equitable online learning environments conducive to academic success and personal growth.

# THE IMPACT OF ONLINE DATING APPS ON THE MENTAL AND SOCIAL WELL-BEING OF THE UNDERGRADUATES IN SRI LANKA

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This research paper investigates the impact of online dating apps on the mental and social wellbeing of undergraduate students in Sri Lanka. The objective of this study is to examine the frequency, duration, and types of interactions on online dating apps, as well as their correlation with mental and social wellbeing indicators. A sample of 204 undergraduate students participated in the survey, providing demographic information and responses to Likert-scale questions assessing online dating app usage, mental wellbeing (including happiness, self-esteem, anxiety, depression, and stress levels), and social wellbeing (including sense of belonging, quality of relationships, and social support). The research found that online dating app usage is prevalent among undergraduate students in Sri Lanka, with participants reporting frequent engagement and utilizing multiple apps. Messaging emerged as the most common interaction type. While participants generally reported positive outcomes in terms of happiness, self-esteem, and relationship quality, occasional anxiety and moderate stress levels associated with app usage were observed. Socially, participants indicated a moderate sense of belonging in online dating communities, with opportunities for social support. Recommendations are made to promote healthier usage patterns and enhance the overall wellbeing of online dating app users, including education and awareness programs, access to supportive resources, collaboration with app developers for platform design improvements, further research, and cultural sensitivity in interventions. This study contributes to a better understanding of the implications of online dating app usage for undergraduate students in Sri Lanka and offers actionable insights for stakeholders aiming to support their wellbeing in the digital age.

## PERCEPTIONS AND EXPERIENCES OF STUDENT-TEACHER INTERACTION IN A NON-STATE HIGHER EDUCATION SECTOR: A CASE STUDY OF SAEGIS CAMPUS

Drawing on existing literature, the study underscores the role of communication channels, teaching strategies, and institutional contexts in shaping interaction dynamics. Methodologically, this research employs a mixed-methods approach, integrating qualitative data from semi-structured interviews with students and teachers, alongside quantitative data from surveys distributed to students. The findings of this study aim to contribute to a deeper understanding of effective student-teacher interactions in private university settings, with significant implications for enhancing teaching practices and student engagement strategies.

# EXPLORING THE IMPACT OF ROMANTIC RELATIONSHIPS ON ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE: A CASE STUDY OF SAEGIS CAMPUS, SRI LANKA

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This qualitative study explores the impact of romantic relationships and love affairs on the academic performance of students at Saegis Campus, Sri Lanka. Through in-depth, semi-structured interviews with a diverse group of students, the research aims to uncover how these relationships influence various aspects of academic life. The study also explores how these dynamics vary across different demographics, such as gender, age, and cultural background, recognizing that the impact of romantic relationships can differ significantly among diverse student groups. Additionally, the role of social support networks, including family and friends, is considered in understanding how these external factors mediate the impact of romantic engagements on academic performance. Preliminary findings suggest a complex interplay between romantic relationships and academic performance, highlighting both challenges and benefits. These insights are crucial for educators and university administrators who aim to develop support services that address the holistic needs of students. By understanding the intricate relationship between romantic engagements and academic responsibilities, stakeholders can better support student well-being and academic success. #### FINTECH ADOPTION BY CUSTOMERS IN SRI LANKA; THE ROLE OF PERCEIVED CYBER SECURITY RISK

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The most recent breakthrough to the financial services industry is FinTech, which is about facilitating financial services in a digitally enabled platform. Within Sri Lanka, there are some FinTech startups, while most of them are still underrated. Even some of the banks within the country have adopted the FinTech characters, yet still, it is not fully occupied as the consumers are having unstable willingness to accept such. Previous researchers have identified that among various reasons, the cybersecurity risk has been the most severe case, which triggers the customers' lack of confidence on FinTech services. According to the existing body of literature, it has been found that FinTech is far more efficient despite its lack of adoption. Within Sri Lanka, it is less studied the impact of cybersecurity risk, especially as a country ranked 78th position in cybersecurity risk, out of 160 countries according to National Cybersecurity Risk Index (NSCI). Therefore, the contemplation of this study is to identify the customers' perception on cybersecurity risk towards adopting FinTech services. The author takes a quantitative approach in analyzing the phenomenon which the data is collected through a questionnaire from 385 respondents which will lead to 4.53% of margin error. The variables included in the model are derived from Technology Acceptance Model (TAM) and the Unified Theory of Acceptance and Use of Technology (UTAUT). The FinTech adoption is represented with three statements covering usage intentions which facilitated by UTAUT, and as the independent variables, data security, platform security and customer trust are employed. All the variables are measured with Likert scale and occupied multiple regression analysis. The results indicated that there are quite high concerns about the cybersecurity risk on the FinTech adoption where the customer trust and the data security were the most significant factors that determines the FinTech adoption. Therefore, it is worthwhile for FinTech startups to build the initial trust on the customers, and ensures the proper security options, otherwise, the FinTech development within Sri Lanka would be continually challenging.

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The ecological stability of Adam's Peak (also known as "Sri Pada"), a revered pilgrimage site in Sri Lanka, is at risk due to prolong unsustainable waste disposal practices. Adam's Peak is a sacred Sri Lankan world heritage site that attracts many local and foreign pilgrims of Buddhist, Hindu, Muslim and Christian religions in the season of January to May and collects approximately more than 100 tons of garbage. This research seeks to address the problem of prolonged unsustainable waste management at Adam's Peak by identifying and promoting sustainable waste management strategies through a multi-stakeholder approach with the aim of that implementing a multi-stakeholder approach will significantly improve the sustainability of waste management practices at Adam's Peak by integrating perspectives from pilgrims, relevant authorities, and the community. A mixed-method design will be employed, comprising questionnaires and interviews. The quantitative sample will target 150 individuals, a mix of local and foreign pilgrims and related authorities through a questionnaire, while the qualitative sample will involve interviews with 10 foreign pilgrims, 25 local pilgrims, and 15 related officials. Purposive sampling will focus on the qualitative sample, while stratified random sampling will focus on the quantitative sample for a better approach. Methodological triangulation will be employed to ensure the accuracy of the research, using AMOS structural equation modeling for the statistical analysis of quantitative data and thematic analysis for qualitative data. While the generalizability of findings may be limited by the sample size, the study will provide valuable insights into sustainable waste management behaviors across diverse cultural backgrounds. Ultimately, this research will contribute to long-term environmental sustainability at Adam's Peak while preserving its cultural significance.

# HOW CAN DESIGN ELEMENTS IMPACT GREEN EVENTS' BRANDING IN FIVE STAR HOTELS IN SRI LANKA? INSIGHTS FROM BANQUET MANAGERS

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Event branding plays a pivotal role in event management and has a substantial influence on the success of events. With the emerging concerns for green practices, an empirical gap for branding green events in relation to cultural and social fabric of the nation outlining green food and environment in the Sri Lankan event stakeholders' operation was identified. Hence, this study explores the influence of design elements on green event branding in Sri Lanka from the viewpoint of banquet managers. This qualitative study employs an exploratory strategy, undergoing semi-structured interviews with 15 banquet managers from leading five-star hotels in Sri Lanka chosen from purposive sampling technique. Afterwards, the qualitative content analysis was endured to analyse the collected data. The findings revealed that design elements such as logos, color schemes, typography, and visual imagery play a significant role when promoting green events branding in the hospitality industry, and further banquet managers specifically ascertained the need to include cultural and traditional components into events branding to appeal it to the national and international clients. It is noteworthy to state that banquet managers confront several problems in executing successful green event branding strategies due to financial limitations, lack of creative flexibility, and constraint of resources. However, they pinpointed the necessity of coordination between events managers, designers, and patrons to establish a consistent green branding approach in the industry. The study gives implications to different industry stakeholders such as to establish successful branding strategies that connect the clientele and industry stakeholders, and produce a memorable experience to guests by initiating steps to enhance green practices in events in the hospitality industry.

# A STUDY ON THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF COMMUNITY-BASED SUSTAINABLE TOURISM WITH REFERENCE TO SOUTHERN PROVINCE IN SRI LANKA

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Community-Based Sustainable Tourism (CBST) is increasingly acknowledged for its potential to foster economic growth and sustainable practices in Sri Lanka's Southern Province, a region selected for its vibrant tourism sector and significant local engagement in tourism activities. This study investigates the economic impacts of CBST within Southern Province, motivated by the need to understand how the community-based tourism activities influence local economies and to identify issues related to economic inequality within these communities. The research employs a mixed methods approach to provide a comprehensive analysis. A sample of 200 local residents was surveyed, and 15 semi-structured interviews were conducted with key stakeholders, including restaurant owners, shopkeepers, and transportation providers. The sampling techniques included stratified random sampling for the residents to ensure representation across different demographic groups and purposive sampling for stakeholders to capture a wide range of perspectives on tourism impacts. Quantitative data from the surveys were analyzed using SmartPLS software, which revealed that while CBST activities generally have positive economic effects, such as increased income and job opportunities, there are notable disparities in the distribution of these benefits. Qualitative data from the interviews were subjected to thematic analysis, identifying key themes: economic benefits, income inequality, and challenges in achieving equitable distribution. These themes highlight both the advantages of CBST and the obstacles faced by local communities, including limited economic opportunities for some residents. The results indicate that CBST contributes to regional economic growth but also underscores the need for targeted strategies to address income disparities and enhance overall economic inclusion. This research advocates for strategic policy interventions to optimize economic outcomes from sustainable tourism practices, promoting balanced development and maximizing benefits for all stakeholders in Sri Lanka's Southern Province.

## MAIN FEATURES IN THE 13TH CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT OF SRI LANKA AND POWER DEVOLUTION STRUCTURES IN OTHER COUNTRIES

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The 13th Constitutional Amendment to the Constitution of Sri Lanka, enacted in 1987, stands as a pivotal legislative measure aimed at addressing the ethnic conflict and promoting regional autonomy within the country. This Amendment introduced a system of Provincial Councils, thereby decentralizing administrative powers and providing a framework for power-sharing between the central government and the provinces. The primary features of the 13th Amendment include the establishment of provincial councils with legislative and executive powers, the delineation of subjects for devolution, and the introduction of the Provincial Council List, Concurrent List, and Reserved List, which categorize the subjects for which the provincial councils and central government share or retain authority. Comparative analysis of power devolution structures in other countries, such as India, Canada, and the United Kingdom, reveals varying models of federalism and autonomy. In India, the federal system is characterized by a clear demarcation of powers between the central and state governments, with a strong central government and significant autonomy for states in certain areas. Canada's federal structure allows for substantial provincial independence, particularly in education and health, while maintaining a strong central government. The United Kingdom presents a unique case of asymmetric devolution, where Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland have varying legislative power. Each model reflects the respective countries' historical, cultural, and political contexts, offering diverse approaches to addressing regional demands for autonomy and governance. The 13th Amendment's implementation in Sri Lanka has faced challenges, including resistance from various political factions and issues related to the actual transfer of powers to provincial councils. Understanding these dynamics and learning from other countries' experiences with devolution can provide valuable insights for strengthening Sri Lanka's governance framework and promoting sustainable peace and development.
